## AGAPE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL - CODE OF CONDUCT

#### Disciplinary and Rewards Policy

Every teacher is responsible for discipline and has the full authority and responsibility to correct the behavior of learners whenever such correction is necessary. Any corrective measures or disciplinary action will correspond with and be appropriate to the offence.

All learners will abide by the disciplinary system that has been developed to assist and guide

learner behavior in the school.

#### A: GRADING OF OFFENCES

Offences are graded according to the nature and degree of seriousness of the offences, of which Category 4 offences are the most serious.

#### **B:** DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

All learners will have a BLUE CARD where record will be kept of their points. Each learner starts with 1000 points in the beginning of the year. Learners will be awarded points or lose points as the year progress. The Blue cards will go home every second Friday for the parents to sign. Category 1 offences and disciplinary interventions will be dealt with by the teacher involved. Category 2, 3 and 4 offences will be referred to the Principal who will then see to the disciplinary action that needs to be taken, e.g. Warning letter, In School Suspension etc.

#### Category 1 Offences - 25 Points

All Category 1 offences will be dealt with by the staff member concerned who will deduct 25 points from the learner's total.

#### Category 2 Offences – 50 Points

All Category 2 offences will immediately be referred to the Principal. The staff member will, in consultation with the Principal, arrange an interview with the learner. 50 Points will be deducted.

#### Category 3 Offences – 100 Points

All Category 3 offences will immediately be reported to the Principal. The Principal will refer the matter, depending on the severity of the offence. The parent/guardian will be informed telephonically about the offence and be notified in writing.

#### Category 4 Offences - 200 Points

All Category 4 offences will immediately be reported to the Principal. The Principal will refer the matter to the Senior Management Team. The parent/guardian will be informed telephonically about the offence and be notified in writing.

Failure to comply with the interventions and corrective measures will lead to further interventions and may lead to the offence being categorized at a higher grade. Expulsion may be recommended for a Category 3 and a Category 4 offence. Below is a breakdown of interventions at various stages.

1000 Points	
800 Points	Written Warning, Parents contacted
600 Points	Written Warning, Parents contacted
400 Points	Final Written Warning, Daily report for 2 weeks, Parents contacted
200 Points	Parent/Learner/Teacher meeting, In school suspension for 2 school days
0 Points	Parent/Learner/Teacher meeting, Out of school suspension for 5 school days

AFTER A LEARNER HAS REACHED 0 POINTS, HE OR SHE WILL AUTOMATICALLY RECEIVE 300 POINTS TO START BUILDING ON. IF A LEARNER SHOULD REACH 0 A SECOND TIME, THEN THE OPTION OF EXPULSION WILL BE DISCUSSED.

#### C: REWARDS SYSTEM

Learners will receive points every time they perform above and beyond of what is expected of them. Register teachers will sign the Blue Cards every Friday and keep a record of those learners that must receive rewards.

Below is a list of actions that learners may points for.
